## FREE SCHOOL MEALS

Free school meals are an entitlement to any child whose family is in receipt of certain state benefits. Information on eligibility can be found at the following web address:

I would like to encourage any parents who may be entitled to their child receiving benefits-linked free school meals (FSM), to please take advantage of this offer. Not only will this mean that an added financial pressure is lifted, but you will also be helping the school to provide additional educational provision for your child through the Pupil Premium. Pupil Premium is a specific allocation of funds that a school receives for each child entitled to benefits-linked free school meals. Currently this is £1,320 per eligible pupil, which can be used by the school to provide additional support for those children.

Our School production, led by the drama club, will take place at Westbury Village Hall on the evenings of 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> of July. If you would like to purchase tickets for the production please return the order form to the school office. ## **CLASS NEWS**

We had a lovely week in Class 1. In literacy we wrote character and setting descriptions. In maths we solved pirate problems. We also had Y6

children come and help us with pirate maths! In Welly Wednesday we pond dipped and we all really enjoyed sports Day.

In literacy Class 2 have finished writing our instructions on how to trap something from a traditional tale e.g. a



bad wolf or a Ogre using time conjunctions. In theme we have used atlas's to find out which countries were part of the Roman Empire. We also labelled a Roman soldier.
