Specialist sports coaches delivering specific PE lessons and CPD	£5,345	Further development of TA, SM, within PE role. SM to work alongside PS on Friday mornings. Continued CPD for RS Friday pm. LR to observe and ensure that PS and teaching staff are sharing planning, taking part in the whole hour session and assessing children	SM taking all PE sessions alongside PS and is assessing children termly. Teacher developing in confidence and understanding of quality PE provision. Team teaching with PS continues to strengthen sustainable high quality PE after funding potentially stops. Children's views of sport are becoming more positive and there have been lots of positive comments about the PE content, as well as PS staff.
Updating resources	£1,000	Purchasing of new netball posts, nets and balls.	Better quality of resources now available for children and teachers to use for PE sessions. These will support good PE for the future.
Specialist Dance Sessions	£800	Children to take part in dance session both during school time and during after school activities. DC to teach dance to class 2, VP to lead dance in C3 and SH to offer after school dance session to lower K51. VP to offer after school dance session after oct.	Dance4Sure is offering after school dance as well as completing a term with C3 and starting in C1. Quality of dance has improved already in C1 and C3 with children learning and understanding different genres of dance. All children enjoy dance sessions and understand how physical the activity is. A dance curriculum is developing, which will support teachers delivering this in the future. Class 1 and 3 teachers are developing their dance skills through the CPD offered by D4S.
Participation in competitions	£400	Children to have experience taking part in competitive sport with children in other schools in GLOWMATCH and Dene Magna partnership.	As a small school, it is difficult for children to have big competitive experiences. Children have therefore had opportunities to play against other schools in rugby, football, netball tournaments. More tournaments will take place during the rest of the academic year 2016-2017.
