CLASS NEWS


Y1's have been writing their own versions of Tinga Tinga tales in literacy, and in maths they have been learning about shapes. Reception children have been matching sounds of the Tinga Tinga animals, practising writing numbers and had great fun with an autumn pumpkin. We also enjoyed making animal pictures using autumn leaves at Welly Wednesday!





This week in class 2 we have been finishing our animal stories, we created our own main character in the style of Fantastic Mr Fox, ask your child what they called theirs! We have been learning about the life, cycle of a plant, as well as starting to think about what categories different loads are in and what we should eat the least/ most of.

The week in Class 3 we have been learning about Non-chronological reports and we have been writing our own about an alien. In maths Yr4's have been learning about shape and line of symmetry and Y5's have been calculating addition and subtraction. Y6 children have been learning about visualising and constructing. In science we have been looking at night and day and how the earth moves.

In order to create as many shoeboxes as possible, we are holding a **non-school uniform day on Monday 29**th **October – the first day of Term 2.** Instead of asking for money, we are asking that you would bring in items that would be suitable for a Christmas shoebox. A list of items include: toothbrush and toothpaste, hairbrush/comb, facecloth and soap, stationery, pens, pencils, paper, gloves, hats and scarves. Please also include a few small gifts, e.g. soft toys, ball, game, puzzle, bubbles. Please do not include the following: No food (except chocolate & sweets), no medicines, no 'military themed' toys or clothing, no dangerous items such as knives or razors, no novels (picture books & colouring books are OK). We are not asking for you to send in all of those items but would be grateful for as many different items as possible so that we can create as many boxes as possible. Last year we were able to create nearly 60 boxes.

We have shoeboxes being delivered on 29th November and will be creating these with the children on Friday 2nd November, after which they will be collected and sent off.

NASAL FLU VACCINE

This year, the nasal flu vaccination programme will be offered to all children in Reception, Year 1, Year 2, Year 3, Year 4 and Year 5 on 14th November. The purpose of this vaccination is to protect against the illness and the potential serious complications such as bronchitis and pneumonia. It also helps to stop the

spread of the illness amongst children, families and wider community. The vaccination will be delivered by a healthcare team. You will have already received an information leaflet and a letter requesting online consent. If you wish to opt out, you must do this online. If you can't do this online, you can see Mrs Cox for a paper consent form.
