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
DEAR PARENTS/CARERS

CLASS NEWS

In Class 1 this week we have been busy. We went on a trip to Brook Farm and leant about how we get milk and saw the cows being milked. We then had milk to try at



Welly Wednesday. Thank you very much to Mark, Dave, Cindy and Sid for showing us around. On Wednesday we went down to the churchyard and lay our poppy wreath with the other remembrance tributes.



This week Class 2 have continued our fruit theme by looking at paintings by Giuseppe Archimboldo and creating our

own versions. We have learnt about some of the different ways plant seeds are dispersed and have drawn pictures with captions to explain this. In Numeracy Year 2 have been using practical and mental methods to consolidate their times tables knowledge, and Year 3 have been using an empty numberline to help with their addition and subtraction calculations.

In Class 3 we are starting to write about a dramatic short film called The Piano. We are learning about writing flashbacks in narratives. In numeracy Year 4 have been learning about



column addition and subtraction, and the Year 5 & 6's have been learning about shapes. In science we are investigating the effect of meteors on the size of a crater. In computing, Year 4's have bee making an animation about space whilst Year 6's have been working on their moon buggies. Year 5 children have been creating 3D art.
