

## DEAR PARENTS/CARERS

19th October 2021

Dear Parents and Carers,

I thought I would update you on my current situation.

As you know, I had to go for a PCR test on Sunday morning due to being alerted that I had been in contact with someone who had tested positive for COVID-19 (though I don't know who that was!). At that time, I had no symptoms of COVID and felt fine, but it seemed prudent to cancel the family service at Westbury Church just in case.

Unfortunately, when my PCR test came back it was a positive result and I am currently at home feeling very unwell with a nasty headache and feeling totally exhausted. I won't be leaving my house until 27<sup>th</sup> October!

This has highlighted a few things for me, not least, that it was the correct thing to do in cancelling the family service, which has been rescheduled for 21<sup>st</sup> November at 10am. It has also demonstrated the importance of regular LFT testing. Currently, all members of staff test twice weekly and this will continue. It also proves to me that, despite having had both vaccinations and wearing face-coverings when in shops, it has not prevented me from catching COVID-19, so we all have to be very vigilant in our actions and interactions.

You may be wondering what implications there are for school. Well, I have been in touch with the Local Authority and thankfully the implications are that I must isolate until I am better! Children and staff will continue to come to school as normal, but if anyone has any symptoms or feels unwell, they should stay at home and book a PCR test – this is the same procedure as it always has been. Classes will not close unless there is insufficient staff to ensure that the safety of the children is maintained, in which case, children will stay at home and revert to remote-learning until staff return.

I want to thank you all for the way in which you have continued to support the school and our efforts to keep everyone safe. By keeping poorly children at home, you are helping to stop any potential spread of any illness that might be doing the rounds in school. Of course, the difficulty is that children can be the most asymptomatic, which means they don't always display any symptoms, just carry the illness. However, the fact that we have had very few cases in our school shows that all our efforts is having a good effect.

As I won't see you now until after half-term and I really need to sleep, I will finish by wishing you all a very good and healthy holiday.
