CONSENT FORM

At the beginning of the school year, we asked that you send back a consent form regarding school trips. I want to clarify that until it is deemed safe to do so, we will not be taking children on school trips. The purpose of the consent form is to give us permission to take children on trips, **if they start or finish outside of the normal school day.** The form also gives us your permission to administer emergency first aid, should it be necessary if we are taking children on visits outside the school day or on a residential visit. You will have already given medical consent for administering first aid during the school day. Please read the consent form carefully as this information is explained within it.

We would like to relaunch our support for this with our virtual Harvest Festival, which will take place on Monday 19th October at 2pm as part of our Weekly Family Worship. Swallowtail and Elvers class news



We've had an exciting week! Monday was Elvers first Muddy Monday session and Wednesday was Swallowtails first Welly Wednesday! Both groups really enjoyed exploring and investigating in our Forest School area.

Swallowtails had R.E on Monday and looked at the creation story and the Christian belief that God created all living things. We also took part in Family Worship.

Woodpeckers have been writing instructions for making felt vegetables. We have been researching and finding out about Beatrix Potter. In science, we have been learning about food chains. We researched the food chains for Peter Rabbit, Jeremy Fisher, Squirrel Nutkin and Mrs Tiggy-Winkle! In Literacy, we



started writing our own Beatrix Potter Tales. We used adjectives to describe our characters and settings.

ADMISSION TO PRIMARY SCHOOL

Any child born between 1st September 2016 and 31st August 2017 can start school in the school year starting from 1st September 2021. Gloucestershire County Council (GCC) co-ordinates the admission of children to primary or infant school, therefore you must apply to them to receive a school place for your child by the closing date of 15th January 2021. This is very important and attending our preschool does not entitle you to a place at our school. It is vitally important therefore that you do not miss the deadline. You should receive a letter from GCC during November 2020, advising you how to apply. If you do not hear from them by the end of November, you must contact the admissions team at school.admissions@gloucestershire.gov.uk

brothers and sisters. If siblings are in the same class they will be able to have their photos taken together. We will arrange for all the children to have individual photos taken, siblings in the same class will also have a joint photo taken. Photos will also be taken of children who are attending our preschool on the day, if your child does not usually attend on a Monday they are very welcome to come into school at 8.45am to have their photo taken. Please let us know if you do not want your child to be photographed. We appreciate that this will be a disappointment to some parents, but it is outside of our control this year.

TEAMS4U SHOEBOX APPEAL 2020

Each year we are delighted to take part in the Team4U Shoebox appeal. And we are always overwhelmed by the generosity that you as parents and carers give to helping us create shoebox Christmas parcels for disadvantaged children. However, this year we will be doing this differently. As you can appreciate, we are not able to mix children across their class bubbles and as a result, we will not be able to create shoebox parcels in the way we have before. We would still like to take part in this annual initiative, so this year we will be sending home a quarantined shoebox for each family represented in school. You are under no obligation to fill the shoebox and return it, but if you would like to create a shoebox parcel as a family,



they can be returned to school on either Monday 2nd November or Tuesday 3rd November. This will give us time to quarantine them again before they are collected on Friday 6th November. We will send home a leaflet with a list of suggested items for the parcels, with the shoeboxes. We will send the shoeboxes home on Thursday 22^{nd} October or Friday 23^{rd} October.

Christmas will be very different this year for so many of us and even more so for those children living in the worst poverty. With your help, we can bring some joy into their lives. Thank you again for your support with this worthwhile project.
