Hello Westbury School families,

The chance of a lifetime

This is an invitation to every family connected to the school in Westbury on Severn. It is more for the **parents and past pupils** than for current pupils at the school.

It is an invitation to all family members above the age of 11 to think about coming to a **service of confirmation** at Blaisdon church in June. The date is **June 30th**, and the time is **10am**. The service lasts a little under an hour, and it need not commit you to further regular attendance.

The service of confirmation is very like baptism, but there are two main differences. In confirmation the promises are made by you, not by godparents, and the service is conducted by a Bishop, not the Vicar (although I will be help-ing!). That's why it doesn't happen locally very often. Most of us were baptised as youngsters, but my guess is that there are many of us who have not yet been confirmed. This would be a great opportunity to do exactly that, and make the Christian faith your own for life. As far as I can see, the only valid reason for not doing so is if you actually don't believe in God.
