The Swallowtails and Elvers have had a fun week. On Monday Elvers went and had an explore in our Forest school area before they start their Muddy Monday session next week. We have had an experiment in our classroom this week, we have been investigating what happens to cress seeds when they are on wet and dry paper and talking about our observations. We have been thinking about our families and writing about them. In maths we have been focussing on number, counting forwards and backwards, using words and numerals.





In Literacy, Woodpeckers have been retelling the Tale of Mrs. Tiggy-Winkle. They wrote questions on Mrs Tiggy-Winkle's washing and they are now hanging up on a washing line in our classroom!

In Science, we have been researching habitats and recording it.

In DT, we wrote instructions for our felt vegetables.


CONSENT FORM
