## Preschool September 2020:

Preparations are well and truly underway for our new preschool room and we expect building work to be completed by the middle of the summer break. I am pleased to announce however, that Mrs Jo Trigg will be joining our staff in September to help assist the running of Preschool. She will be with us full time from September. Mrs Anita Hayward will also be joining us part-time from September to also help in the running and delivery of preschool. Both Mrs Trigg and Mrs Hayward come with great experience, expertise, knowledge and skills in preschool and have come directly from existing successful settings. They are both already known to the school community and Mrs Trigg is known by most of our existing preschool families as she helped to lead Bright Horizons Preschool before its recent closure. I know you will join me in wishing them great happiness and success as they settle into our Westbury Family and school community.

Please do spread the word about our preschool. We still have spaces and can be flexible with times. In addition to the 15 hours free-funded places we offer; we are also offering 30hours free-funded places to those who are eligible. This means that if eligible, attending full-time should only cost £6.25 per week! If you are not sure if you qualify for this provision for your 3 or 4-year-old pre-schooler, then come and speak to us in the office.

## Return to School in September:

It is our intention, along with the Government's, to welcome all children back to school in September. The term dates have already been issued and we have no intention of deviating from these term dates unless something happens before September. Children will therefore start school on Wednesday September 2<sup>nd</sup>. We may need to have staggered start and finishing times, but this will be detailed to you during the summer break.

## Year 5&6 PGL Residential 2021:

A letter is attached regarding the PGL Residential to Liddington for next year's Y5&Y6 children. Please do read it and return the permission slip. A deposit of £30 will be required in September. However, if any current Year 5 pupils have paid any deposit or money towards this year's visit, then this will be transferred across.
