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# Class News

### **CHESTNUTS**

Chestnuts have made use of the warmer weather and have been spending lots of time outside either in the EYFS area making ramps to practise their balancing or for cars to race down. They have been playing on the swing and building dens and pretend fires. Those starting school in September have nearly finished learning the different sounds to the letters, only a couple more weeks left before we start recapping all of the sounds. For all those children that will be staying in Pre-school next year please could you let Mrs Trigg know which days and hours you would like for next year, so that staffing can be sorted. Thank you to those that have already done so. Please note that from September we will be open till 5pm and accepting children from 2 yrs 9 months



### **WILLOW**

Willow Class have had a busy couple of weeks. In History, we welcomed a special guest speaker who shared their memories of toys and houses from the past. The children have loved hearing about their favourite childhood toy and have enjoyed comparing toys

from then and now, discussing how they have changed over time. In PE, we have been developing our gymnastics skills. In English, we have been reading the story of *The Magic Porridge Pot*. We even made porridge as a class and wrote our own instructions titled *How to Make Delicious Porridge*. In Maths, Year 1 have been learning about mass, using balancing scales to compare and measure different objects, while Reception have been playing number track games to help with counting forwards and backwards.



## **SYCAMORE**

Sycamore Class have been writing their own stories based on mud larking and **Thames** and **Tide Club.** They have based theirs on mud larking in the River Severn.

In Art we are producing our own piece of artwork based on William Turner of a scene from The Great Fire of London. In Geography, we have been learning about North America focusing on Canada and it's physical and human features. In Maths the Year 2s are finishing off their money unit while the Year 3s have started their fractions and calculating unit.



We've covered a lot in Oak class over the last few weeks. In Science, we've explored how light travels, how our eye works, and how shadows are made and how they can change. In Art, we've created our final pieces using Greek columns as inspiration and our brilliant artwork is up on display in the corridors for you to see when you're next in. In History we've explored some of the Greek Gods and their skills and origin stories, we used this information to create Top Trump cards. In English we've finished **Romeo and Juliet** and are creating narratives of alternative endings this week.

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# CHESTNUTS UPDATE

We have recently made some big decisions about expanding our Chestnuts class (Preschool). This is because we have noticed how well pupils transition into the Reception year when they have attended Chestnuts and because demand is growing.

# From September 2025:

- Chestnuts will be in the room that is currently adjacent to Oak, behind the temporary wall. This will allow us to take in more children and to keep access to the outside play area. Willow will be next door.
- Children will be able to start when they are <u>2 years 9 months</u>, rather than currently, aged 3.
- We will be staying open till 5pm on days when the demand is there. The plan is for this eventually to be daily.

We know that our Preschool is excellent and our staff are highly experienced, caring and knowledgeable. Ofsted in 2024 were so incredibly impressed with what we offer the youngest children so it makes sense to expand this community provision.

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# Safeguarding updates

Younger and younger children are accessing phones and I-pads. From time to time children talk in school about using social media platforms. This can be a risk to their safety/wellbeing. Whenever we attend safeguarding training, we hear about incidents of young children being groomed or blackmailed by adults on these apps (through images), or being accidentally exposed to unsuitable content.

Parental controls can block these apps and manage your child's screen time.
