PE has also been great and we have enjoyed having Progressive Sports for the whole day now on Monday and Friday.

So as you can see, despite the enormous frustrations and challenges that this pandemic has brought, we have tried to keep a level of normality for the children and given then a continued rounded education, whilst still developing their basic core skills and plugging gaps!

The children have been amazing as always and they have worked so hard to catch up on lost learning over lockdown. Having said this, we are so grateful for the way you all responded to supporting the home-learning and we have seen so many fantastic pieces of work that the children sent back into school.

Under the new Government regulations, staff have been undergoing training on our new remote learning platform, that will be launched sometime in November. This will ensure that if children need to self-isolate or we have another national lockdown, the children will be able to continue learning at home – more details will follow about this.

We welcomed our new Preschool children into school in September and I have been amazed by their resilience to the long term and how well they have settled in. We have been learning a lot this term through our Preschool and are excited about how we develop this further.

As well as the Preschool and Reception children, we have been delighted to welcome some other new families to our school and are so delighted with the way they have settled in. On that note, please remember that despite the chaos in life, we are always here for you and will do whatever we can to help. We don't always get things right first time and we learn along the way, but there isn't anyone here who wouldn't do anything they could to help and support you and your child if you need it.

ADMISSION TO PRIMARY SCHOOL

Any child born between 1st September 2016 and 31st August 2017 can start school in the school year starting from 1st September 2021. Gloucestershire County Council (GCC) co-ordinates the admission of children to primary or infant school, therefore you must apply to them to receive a school place for your child by the closing date of 15th January 2021. This is very important and attending our Preschool does not entitle you to a place at our school. It is vitally important therefore that you do not miss the deadline. You should receive a letter from GCC during November 2020, advising you how to apply. If you do not hear from them by the end of November, you must contact the admissions team at school.admissions@gloucestershire.gov. uk
